

Anti-model: picturing a bad situation

An ANTI-MODEL is a picture of a bad situation. An ANTI-MODEL is when you picture a situation without good value.

Here is an example:

Imagine a world without education.

An ANTI-MODEL says:

This is what things would be like if we don't have that public value I'm talking about

Look how **bad** it would be

Take this picture into your heart. Use it to motivate yourself. Make sure things are not like that.

Examples

Here is an example:

Imagine a world without education.

Without education, people would not be able to better themselves.

Without education, communities would have to rely on outsiders to fill key positions.

Without education, young people would see no hope for themselves and can take up substance abuse.

Notice how you put what you are talking about is at **the end** of the first sentence. Then you put it at **the beginning** of all the other sentences.

Also notice you have to say **would**, because you are not saying it **will be like this**, but it **would be like this, if there is no education**.

Another example

Imagine a world without self-respect.

In a world without self-respect, no one would care how they acted or who was with them.

In a world without self-respect, no-one would try to live up to standards of behaviour.

In a world without respect, no-one would try to do the right thing.
